

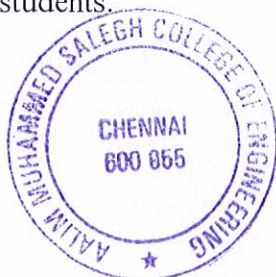

Gaja Cyclone Relief Aid: A Community Outreach by AMSCE

In response to the devastating impact of the Gaja Cyclone in 2018, the National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of Aalim Muhammed Salegh College of Engineering organized a relief program to extend support to affected communities in the delta region of Tamil Nadu, India. The NSS volunteers and faculty members journeyed to the delta region with vehicles loaded with essential supplies, including food, clothing, and other relief materials, which were carefully organized to ensure the efficient distribution to those in need. Volunteers worked tirelessly, ensuring that the aid reached the right hands, especially focusing on vulnerable groups such as elderly individuals, children, and families who had lost their homes and possessions in the cyclone. This outreach activity was more than just a relief effort; it provided students and faculty with a firsthand experience of the hardships faced by disaster-stricken communities. Witnessing the resilience of affected individuals and the gratitude of recipients left a profound impact on everyone involved. 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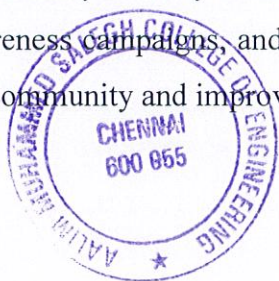
Empowering Communities through Rural Engagement: A Visit to Kilakondaiyur Village

A group of 50 students from Aalim Muhammed Salegh College of Engineering, under the guidance of NSS Program Officer Dr. K. Sureshkumar, embarked on a field visit to Kilakondaiyur Village in Thiruvallur district on November 16, 2022. This visit was part of the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan initiative, reflecting the college's commitment to fostering rural development and enhancing community welfare. The NSS unit organized the event with the aim of interacting directly with village residents, understanding their challenges, and identifying areas where they could offer meaningful support.

Kilakondaiyur Village, which has been adopted by the college, provided an ideal setting for students to gain firsthand insights into rural life. This visit served as both a learning opportunity for students and a chance to create a bridge between academic knowledge and practical community needs. Students were encouraged to engage in active discussions with the residents, learning about their daily routines, occupations, and the infrastructure challenges they face. The field survey covered various aspects, from education and healthcare to sanitation and local economic activities, allowing students to gather comprehensive information on the village's needs and resources.

They considered various strategies, such as skill-building workshops, health awareness campaigns, and infrastructure improvement projects, which could directly benefit the community and improve the quality of life for the villagers.




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The visit concluded with a commitment from both the students and the college to continue working towards the development of Kilakondaiyur Village. This experience reinforced the role of educational institutions in addressing social challenges, promoting rural development, and preparing students to be responsible citizens. It also underscored the potential of youth engagement in creating a positive impact within communities through continuous support and sustainable solutions.

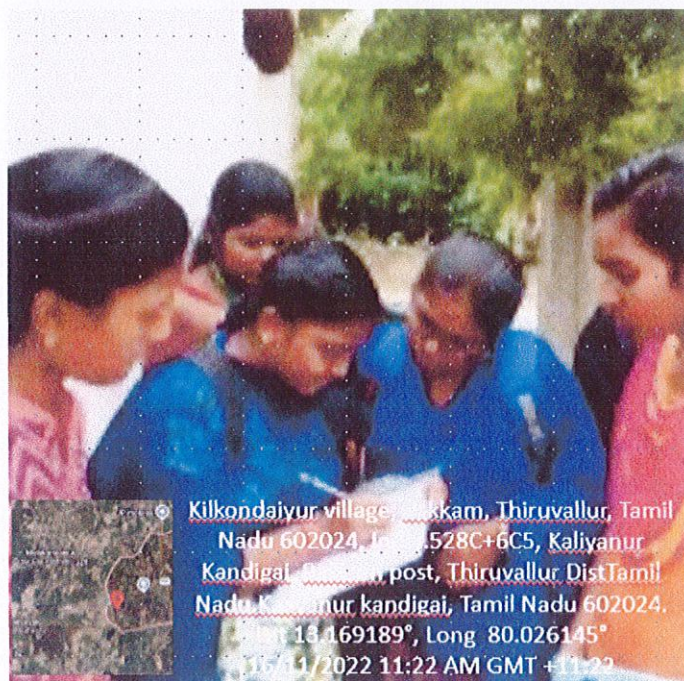

Village household survey by Students



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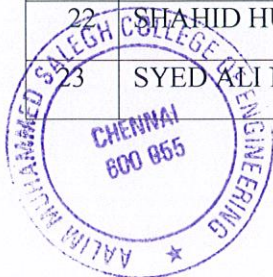

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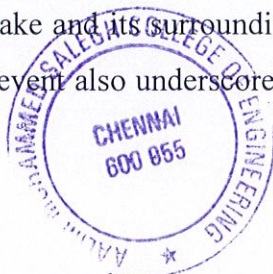

Eco Awareness Rally: NSS Volunteers Champion for the Rejuvenation of Kakkalur Lake

The National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of Aalim Muhammed Salegh College of Engineering organized an Eco Awareness Rally aimed at rejuvenating Kakkalur Lake near Thiruvallur town on 23rd January 2023. The rally, led by NSS Program Officer Dr. K. Sureshkumar, brought together 37 enthusiastic NSS volunteers who embarked on a 3-kilometer walk around the lake. This initiative aimed to promote environmental awareness and encourage community involvement in preserving local water bodies, an essential step toward sustainable ecological practices.

The rally began with an orientation, where volunteers were briefed about the objectives of the initiative and the importance of preserving natural water resources like Kakkalur Lake. 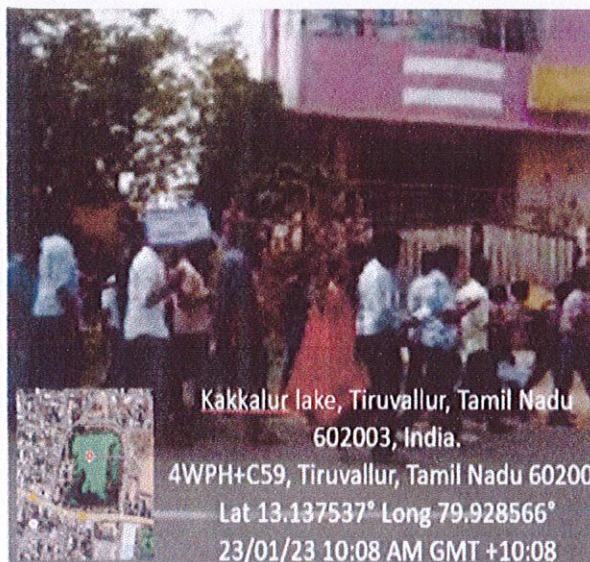

NSS Volunteers Lead Mass Cleaning Initiative at Avadi Municipal High School

On 11th June 2022, the National Service Scheme (NSS) of Aalim Muhammed Salegh College of Engineering, in collaboration with the Greater Chennai Corporation and the Department of Drinking Water Supply, organized a Mass Cleaning Programme at Avadi Municipal High School, located in Pattabiram, Chennai - 72. This activity aimed to promote cleanliness and instill a sense of community responsibility among students and locals. The programme brought together a group of 37 dedicated NSS volunteers, guided by NSS Program Officer Dr. K. Sureshkumar, to contribute towards a cleaner and healthier school environment.

The event was part of a broader initiative aimed at addressing sanitation issues within educational institutions, ensuring a hygienic and conducive learning environment. Before the clean-up began, volunteers gathered for a briefing on safety protocols and the tasks to be undertaken. This initial orientation helped organize the students into teams, each assigned specific areas of the school premises to clean, ensuring that the effort was both systematic and comprehensive. Throughout the activity, the volunteers tackled various tasks, including sweeping classrooms, cleaning corridors, and disposing of waste material around the school premises. Special attention was given to areas prone to litter and dirt accumulation, such as playgrounds, assembly points, and corners around the buildings. The participants also removed weeds, cleared out blocked drainage areas, and arranged seating spaces to enhance the overall cleanliness and usability of the school environment. Their commitment and teamwork were evident as they worked tirelessly, demonstrating a strong sense of responsibility and unity.

The collaboration with the Greater Chennai Corporation and the Department of Drinking Water Supply ensured the provision of necessary tools and materials, such as brooms, garbage bags, gloves, and disinfectants. 

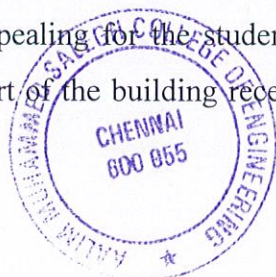
Community Service Initiative: School Rooftop Cleaning and Whitewashing Project at Melapadu

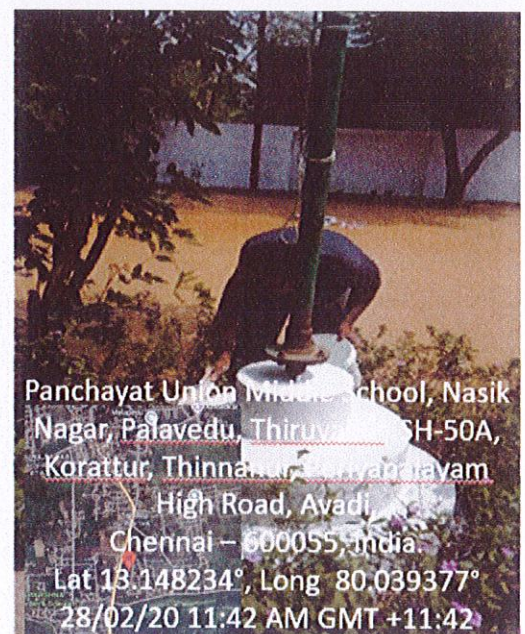

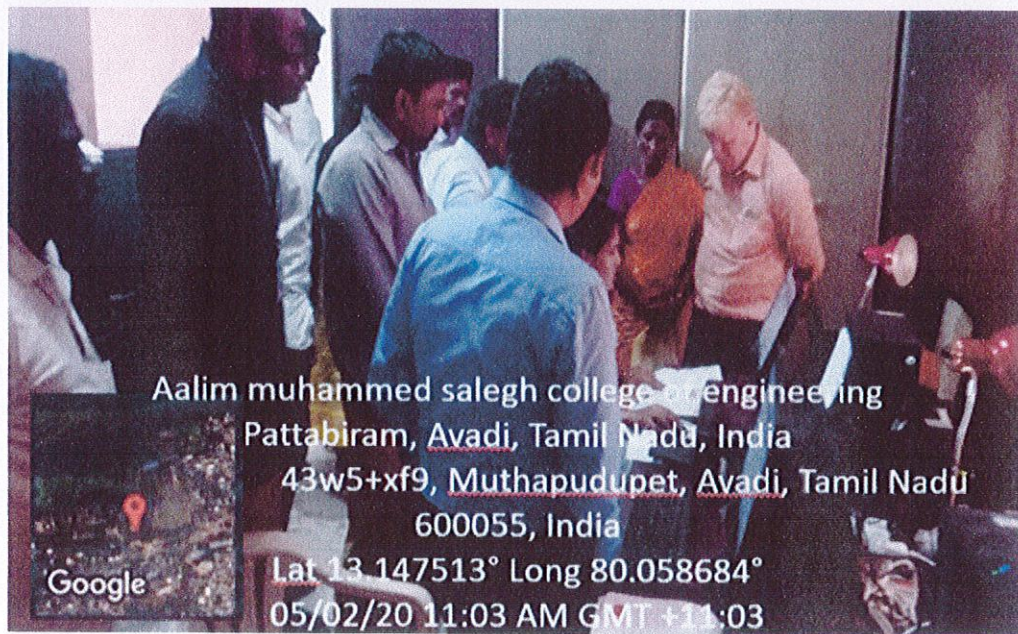

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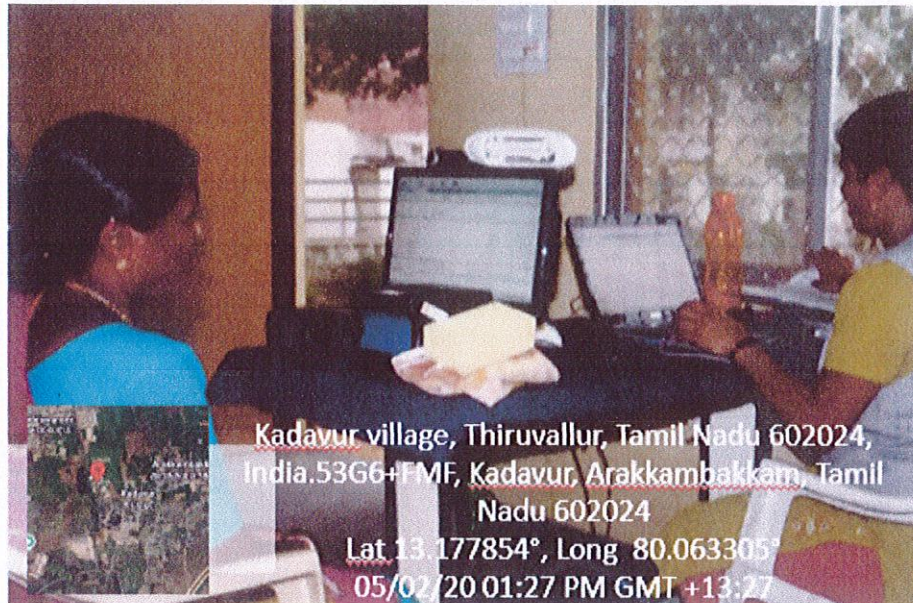

Preventive Health Campaign: Distribution of Nilavembu Kashayam

In October 2019, the National Service Scheme (NSS) unit of Aalim Muhammed Salegh College of Engineering organized a preventive health campaign to combat the spread of Dengue and H1N1 viruses. Volunteers managed the stations efficiently, serving each individual and explaining the benefits of the herbal remedy. Their efforts were complemented by informative talks on the importance of preventive measures against diseases like Dengue and H1N1, emphasizing that personal health care and community awareness are key in reducing the spread of infections. By engaging with their peers in this manner, the volunteers were able to foster a supportive environment that encouraged everyone to prioritize their health.

Nilavembu Kashayam, derived from the plant *Andrographis paniculata*, is well-regarded in traditional Indian medicine for its antiviral and immune-enhancing properties. By promoting its usage, the NSS team aimed to offer a simple yet effective way to boost immunity naturally. The initiative not only helped the students and staff in the short term but also instilled a preventive health mindset that would benefit them in the future. Such practices are especially relevant in densely populated settings like college hostels, where the risk of




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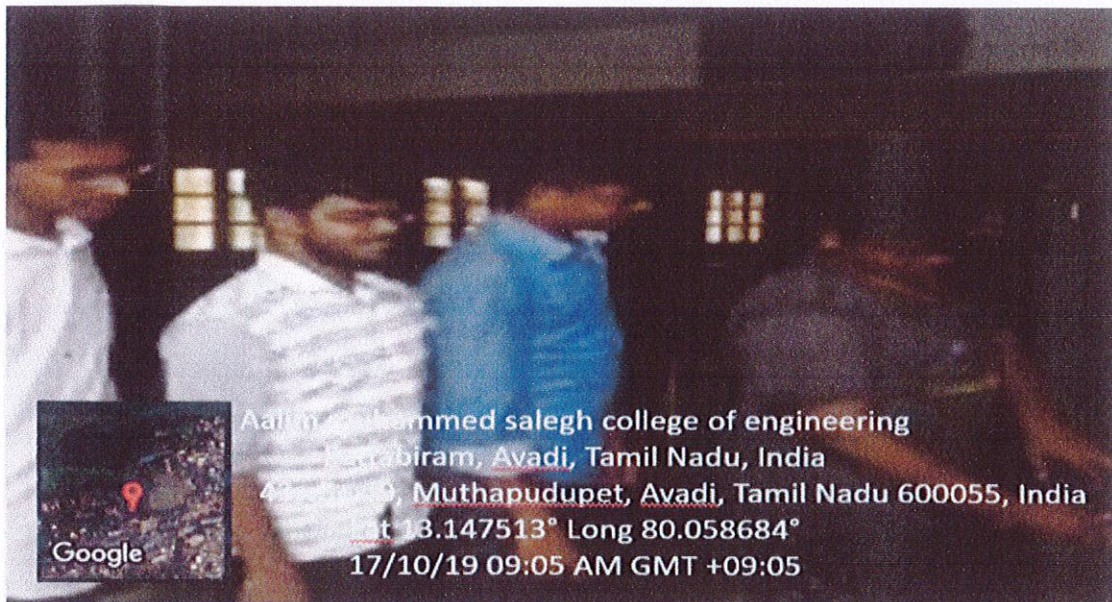

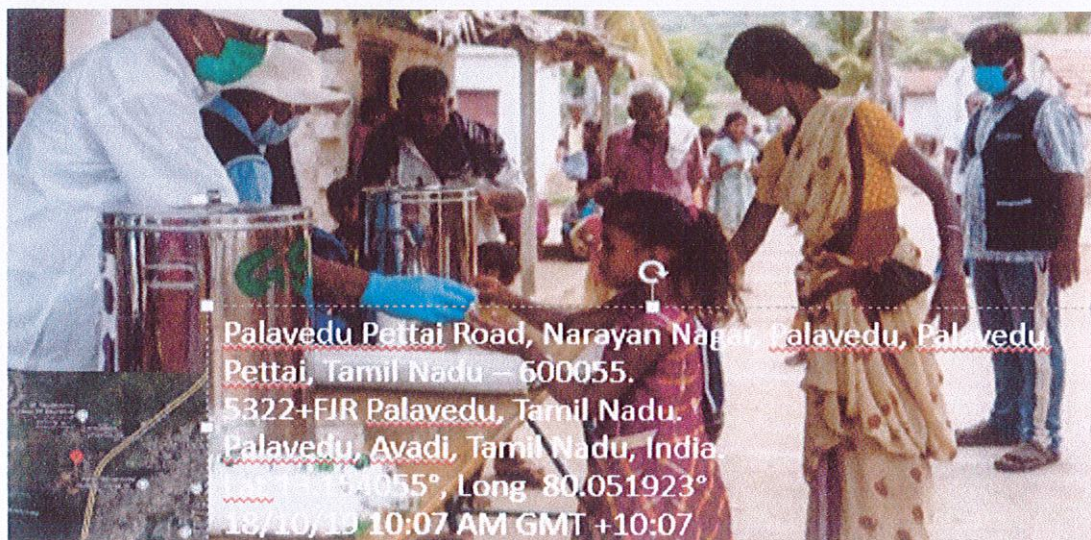

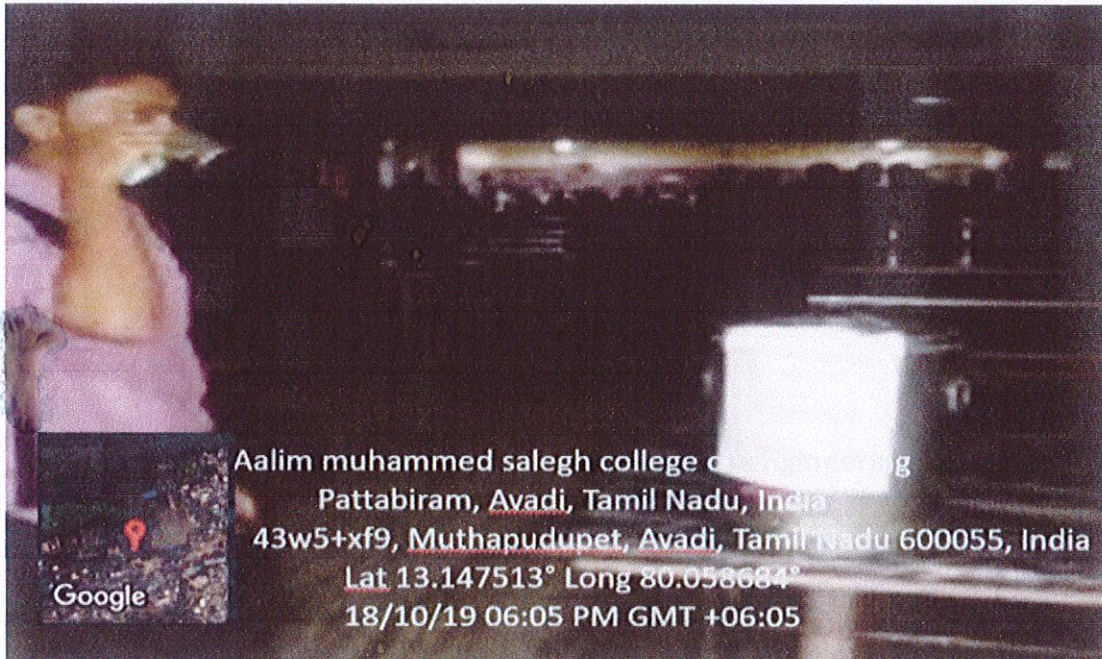
